Minutes of the Barner Reunion-2023

The 99th annual Barner Reunion was held on June 17, 2023, at the St. John's (Barner's) Lutheran Church in rural Liverpool, PA. The weather was partly sunny, cool, and breezy. Attending were 31 family members.

The business meeting was held in the church. President Beth Sowers presided. The minutes and treasurer's reports were accepted.

The president, vice president, secretary/treasurer and two members of the executive committee were up for re-election. A motion was made that the present officers be re-elected. The motion passed. Beth Sowers will continue as president, Charlie Barner will be vice-president, Eunice Barner will be secretary/treasurer, and Chris Barner and Matt Pryber will serve on the executive committee for the next two years.

Charlie Barner gave the history committee report. He reminded us to access the family website, <u>http://www.adambarner.family</u> to see the huge amount of data that is there. Family members can register for an account to be able to access everything; for privacy reasons, no living person is listed or their information available to the general public. Corrections to demographics may be submitted directly on the website. Charlie receives many obituaries to place on the website, and this is an important service to grieving families. However, he would like to be able to list marriages, births, and other happy family news also. (This holds true for the newsletter as well.) He reminded us that the next reunion will be the 100th, so all are urged to come and bring others! Charlie was applauded for his work in maintaining the website.

Beth Sowers reported on the activities of Barner's Church in the last year. Their production of candy Easter eggs netted 13,500 eggs! The proceeds raised by this means were given to local charitable causes. The Apple Butter Boil also was held. The apple butter and the potpie dinner both sold out. Plans are being made to hold it again this year on the 2nd Saturday of October. Because of a lack of volunteers, apple butter will be made on only one weekend. There will be no potpie meal, though the food stand will still be available. The church celebrated its 150th anniversary with many activities on the first weekend of June.

Pastor Bob Lescallette spoke briefly about the history of Barner's Church. He has published a book on the subject, which is available for sale.

There was a motion to donate \$200 to St. John's Lutheran (Barner's) Church in appreciation for their hospitality, and a second motion that \$300 be given to the Barner Learning Center in the Philippines. Both motions were carried unanimously.

All in attendance introduced themselves and shared some thoughts. A cash offering was taken. It amounted to \$220. A picture was taken of those in attendance.

The group gathered at the cemetery, and the wreath was placed at the Adam Barner memorial by Beth Sowers and the youngest family member present, Lilyana Jones.

A luncheon was served by the ladies of the church. As always, the meal was enhanced by conversation, laughter, and good fellowship.

As we prepare to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Adam Barner Family Reunions, I want to remind everyone that we have a website that will provide you with access to the genealogy file. The genealogy file was prepared by others much more familiar with the genealogy research process and contains a database of well over 20,000 names of individuals.

By default, users will only be able to see the detailed information we have relating to individuals who are deceased. Information on living persons is very limited and you will only see initials and surname of these individuals. However, if you wish to see the database in its entirety, you can either log in using your username and password or, if you never registered for an account, you can register for a user account. Accounts are free but the account will give you much more information that the general public cannot see. We limit access to the detailed information as a matter of protecting the privacy of the living.

I often receive information regarding cousins who have passed away. I try to get this information updated as often as I can but I do ask for some patience as it may take a few days to get the revisions made. While I do receive obituaries, it would be nice to receive marriage and birth notices as well. There is a "Contact Us" link on the website that you can use to contact me.

We also have some documents that you might want to look at (or download). For example, many people ask about the brown book that was published years ago. Although the book itself is no longer available in print, the entire text is available in .pdf format on the website.

I will be bringing my laptop to the reunion and will be available to show people how to use the site and register for a user account.

I look forward to seeing as many of you as can possibly make it at this year's reunion. 100 years is a significant milestone and it would be great to see a huge crowd this year!

Barner's Church was once known as Dupp's Church. It dates back to 1794 but may have had congregational organization as early as 1786. It was of the Reformed faith with union arrangements with the Mennonites. The earliest church structure was reportedly on the site of the present-day Adam Barner Monument. The Church in this 1990 photo was built in 1872. In 1927, the congregation became Lutheran and the church is officially known as St. John's Lutheran Church, but it is still widely known as Barner's Church. Land for the church and cemetery was given by Adam Barner's son, George. It was re-deeded in 1926 to the Lutheran Church by Mary F. Wilt, granddaughter of George. It is about 2 miles north of Liverpool.

Directions to Barner's Church from Liverpool, PA

(For your GPS, the address is: 5 Barners Road, Liverpool, PA 17045)

Liverpool, PA - When you are on US 11/15 ...

Turn onto PA Route 17 (at the south edge of town);

Travel 1.6 miles to route 235 (pond on the right). Turn right onto Route 235;

Travel 0.8 mile to a Y in Barner's Church Road (another pond on the right);

Take the right branch of the Y;

Travel 0.9 mile - Cemetery at top of hill. Barner's Church is on the left;

Turn left at Church and park on the grass on the left, just past the church.
